Game: Gnome-one Knows Where He Goes

Game Overview: A classic light-hearted puzzle game that takes place inside of a giant banyan tree. The PLAYER (first-person) must use context clues, solve riddles, explore, and eavesdrop on NPC conversations to find the gnome GARFUND.

Character: Mindrel (the tailor)

Setting: Main entrance

Context: Triggered when interacting with Mindrel on the bench.

1. I fixed up the suit Gar's wearing today, y'know.
2. It's a nice one, mmhmm.
3. Why are you pestering me? I don't have another to offer.
4. You must really like argyle patterns.

Character: Cinnamon (child)

Setting: Main entrance

Context: Triggered when interacting with Cinnamon as she skips.

1. Cinny minny, watch me hop! Cinny minny, I go clop clop!
2. Betch you can't guess my favorite gnome to play with...
3. That's right! It's Garfund!
4. A-ha, but I won't tell you where he's hiding!
5. Why? 'Cause that'd be no fun!

Character: Sven (the butcher)

Setting: Second floor

Context: Triggered when interacting with Sven while he's with a customer.

1. Take a number... Wait your turn...
2. I'm only helping customers buyin' prime cuts today! Ha HA!
3. What're you prattling on about now?
4. Shoo! Can't you see the healthy exchange of coin happenin' here?

Context: Triggered when interacting with Sven when he's unoccupied.

1. Customers will swing by soon enough. Just wait and see.
2. Hn. Iron skulls, it must be a slow day.
3. Where is that gnome? He owes me for that gizzard.

Character: Maple (Garfund's wife)

Setting: Garfund's treehouse

Context: Triggered when interacting with Maple as she sweeps outside her door.

1. (hums to herself) Oh, that? It's my wedding song.
2. (hums to herself) Garfund and I made it up.
3. (hums to herself) He leaves his dirty boots on our mat all the time, so if I'm not sleepin', I'm sweepin'!
